Rauner Wins Republican Primary

Wealthy capitalist Bruce Rauner, using \$6 million of his own money, defeated a surging Kirk Dillard in Tuesday's (March 18) gubernatorial Republican primary.

Now, however, a much tougher fight looms: unseating Governor Pat Quinn who is expected to have heavy support from labor unions, teacher unions, and Cook County.

Who is Rauner? The 59 year old candidate lives in Deerfield and was named by Chicago Magazine as one of the 100 most powerful Chicagoans. He is an alumnus of Dartmouth College and Harvard Business School. He

owns nine (9) homes, including a penthouse on Central Park in New York City, and ranches in Montana and Wyoming.

He is a person who can really relate to the middle class--**Really?** Rauner's wealth comes from GTCR, a private equity firm he joined in 1981. It has invested more than \$10 billion (with a 'B') in over 200 companies with a focus on financial and information services and health care. **Its work has included managing Illinois pension funds!** Rauner retired from the firm in late 2012 and launched R8 Capital Partners which invests in Illinois companies. His reported income in 2012 was \$53 million.

But I've come to bury Rauner, not to praise him.

Opponents of Rauner have criticized some of GTCR's business dealings, in particular an investment in a health company that stripped resources from nursing homes, resulting in deaths, according to legal documents. Rauner's response: The Company was a failed investment.

Rauner is also unapologetic about pulling 'strings' to get his daughter into a competitive Chicago public high school (Walter Payton College Prep) - to which he later donated \$250,000.

Two of the state governor's that Rauner admires are Mitch Daniels of Indiana and Scott Walker of Wisconsin. To quote Rauner: "Scott Walker in Wisconsin has done good things to improve the economy and tax burden (there)."

Rauner has been quoted as saying that teachers should be put on merit pay rather than tenure. "I don't think tenure makes sense. Nobody should have a job for life," he said.

I recently said, "Hell will freeze over before I vote for Quinn again."

Well, get out the ice skates and sleds and the ballot. History will repeat itself in my house once more.
