MINUTES FOR THE KRTA UNIT MEETING September 10, 2014

The September 10 KRTA membership meeting was called to order at 12:40 at Whitetail Ridge Golf Club, Route 126, Yorkville. The Pledge of Allegiance was recited.

President Jim Hissong reported that a KRTA website is in the process of creation. He congratulated past President Pat Coleman on her knowledgeable presentation of the KRTA organization recently on WSPY. He reminded membership of their desired attendance at the September 18 IRTA sponsored Arlington Race Track Day. The \$100 fee will be donated towards the IRTA Legal Defense Fund.

Jim Hissong presented the nominations for the 2015 KRTA offices of 1st Vice-President, 2nd Vice-Presidents, and Secretary. Present 1st VP Janet Reardon, present 2nd VP's Jan Hissong & Tom Meade, and present Secretary Pat Johnson were nominated. There were no nominations from the floor. The motion to approve these nominations was made and approved by the membership.

IRTA Bob Lyons updated the membership on the progress of SB1 challenge in court. It **will** go to the Illinois Supreme Court in 2015. The SB1 challenge will most probably be found unconstitutional. Bob said IRTA believes politically the state cannot cut taxes or raise revenue in order to pay its share towards the pension fund. So the only avenue left for the state will be to change the constitution by amending the pension guidelines. How will they achieve that? They will push for the amendment and passage of it on the political campaign trails. All of that takes time. COLA 3 % should hold for pensioners in 2015 & possibly 2016. Bob answered questions afterwards.

The meeting was adjourned by Jim Hissong.

LEGISLATIVE REPORT

Now that elections are over (except for Illinois Treasurer) we can look at other happenings in the state.

Regarding the Treasurer's race: as of Friday, Nov. 7, Tom Cross had a 21,000 vote lead: but, there are supposedly 100,000 votes from various precincts still to be counted. This includes 24,000 in Cook County (13,000 in Chicago). Neither Cross nor his opponent Mike Frerichs are claiming victory or defeat yet.

Comptroller Judy Baar Topinka on election day announced that, as of late October, there are \$5.82 billion in unpaid bills facing the state of Illinois. The past-due bill count is \$500,000 million greater than the comparable figure in mid-September. This money number is predicted to rise to \$6.4 billion by June, 2015. Some of this debt is, of course, due to the massively underfunded State-managed pension system. Illinois is the lowest rated state of all 50 states in the eyes of all three major bond rating agencies (Fitch, Moody and Standard & Poor). Hello Governor Rauner.

Last Thursday (Nov. 6) as a move to try and increase income into the state's coffers (my opinion), the 12 member Joint Committee on Administrative Rules issued a 'certificate of no objection' to fracking regulations for the state of Illinois. This committee has now authorized the fracking permit process to get underway. With the jumping of this final hurdle, Southern Illinois will, of course, witness the economic boom tied to the hydraulic fracturing of natural oil and gas in Illinois. It could create more than 45,000 jobs and \$9 billion in economic impact for Illinois. My prediction --- marijuana is next.
